<u>Jochebed</u>

If one talks about a miraculous birth, who do you think about? Mary, mother of Jesus and Sarah, mother of Isaac? I want to inform you of another woman, who easily fits into this category, but is largely unknown; because the church has ignored the wisdom of the Book of Jasher, which supplies the missing information. We know that the Israelites were in Egypt for 210 years and that Moses was 80 years old, when he and Aaron spoke to Pharaoh; but the account of the Israelites entering Egypt, reveals an amazing mother.

And Moses was eighty years old and Aaron eighty-three years old when they spoke to Pharaoh. (Exo 7:7)

Now Amram took for himself Jochebed, his father's sister, as wife; and she bore him Aaron and Moses. And the years of the life of Amram were one hundred and thirty-seven. (Exo 6:20)

And a man of the house of Levi went and took as wife a daughter of Levi. So the woman conceived and bore a son. And when she saw that he was a beautiful child, she hid him three months. But when she could no longer hide him, she took <u>an ark of bulrushes</u> for him, <u>daubed it with asphalt and pitch</u>, put the child in it, and laid it in the reeds by the river's bank. And his sister stood afar off, to know what would be done to him. (Exo 2:1-4)

These are the families of the Levites: the family of the Libnites, the family of the Hebronites, the family of the Mahlites, the family of the Mushites, and the family of the Korathites. And Kohath begot Amram. The name of Amram's wife was <u>Jochebed the daughter of Levi</u>, who was born to Levi in Egypt; and to Amram she bore Aaron and <u>Moses and their sister Miriam</u>. (Num 26:58-59)

From these scriptures, Jochebed's importance does not stand out, but let's ask Jasher!

It was about that time that Abraham died, in the fifteenth year of the life of Jacob and Esau, the sons of Isaac, and all the days of Abraham were one hundred and seventy-five years. He died and was gathered to his people in good old age, old and satisfied with days, and Isaac and Ishmael his sons buried him. (Jasher 26:29)

Jacob lived in the land of Egypt seventeen years, and the days of Jacob, and the years of his life were a hundred and forty seven years. (Jasher 56:1)

And the children of Levi were Gershon, Kehath and Merari, and their sister Jochebed, who was born to them in their going down to Egypt. And the sons of Judah were Er, Onan, Shelah, Perez and Zarach. And Er and Onan died in the land of Canaan; and the sons of Perez were Chezron and Chamul. And the sons of Issachar were Tola, Puvah, Job and Shomron. And the sons of Zebulun were Sered, Elon and Jachleel, and the son of Dan was Chushim. (Jasher 59:9-13)

The sons of Levi were Gershon, Kohath and Merari. The sons of Judah were Er, Onan, Shelah, Perez and Zerah (but Er and Onan died in the land of Canaan). The sons of Perez were Hezron and Hamul. The sons of Issachar were Tola, Puvah, Job and Shimron. The sons of Zebulun were Sered, Elon and Jahleel. (Gen 46:11-14)

All the souls that went forth from the loins of Jacob were <u>seventy</u> souls; these are they who came with Jacob their father to Egypt to dwell there: and Joseph and all his brothers lived securely in Egypt, and they are of the best of Egypt all the days of the life of Joseph. And Joseph lived in the land of Egypt ninety-three years, and <u>Joseph reigned over all Egypt eighty years</u>. (Jasher 59:19-20)

All the persons who went with Jacob to Egypt, who came from his body, besides Jacob's sons' wives, were sixty-six persons in all. And the sons of Joseph who were born to him in Egypt were two persons. All the persons of the house of Jacob who went to Egypt were seventy. (Gen 46:26-27)

Genesis concentrates on the people who went into Egypt, seventy in all; but Jasher also mentions Jochebed, who was born on their entering into Egypt. So Jochebed's birth coincides with the event of Israel entering the land of Egypt.

There was a man in the land of Egypt of the children of Levi, whose name was Amram, the son of Kehath, the son of Levi, the son of Israel. And this man went and took a wife, namely Jochebed the daughter of Levi his father's sister, and she was one hundred and twenty-six years old, and he came to her. And the woman conceived and gave birth to a daughter, and she called her name Miriam, because in those days the Egyptians had embittered the lives of the children of Israel. She conceived again and gave birth to a son and she called his name Aaron, for in the days of her conception, Pharaoh began to spill the blood of the male children of Israel. (Jasher 67:2-4)

The king ordered an announcement to be issued and a law to be made throughout the land of Egypt, saying, "Every male child born to the Hebrews from this day forward shall be thrown into the water." Pharaoh called to all his servants, saying, "Go now and search throughout the land of Goshen where the children of Israel are, and see that every son born to the Hebrews will be cast into the river, but every daughter you shall let live." And when the children of Israel heard this thing which Pharaoh had commanded, to cast their male children into the river, some of the people separated from their wives and others adhered to them. (Jasher 67:51-53)

It was at that time the spirit of God was on Miriam the daughter of Amram the sister of Aaron, and she went forth and prophesied about the house, saying, "Behold a son will be born to us from my father and mother this time, and he will save Israel from the hands of Egypt." And when Amram heard the words of his daughter, he went and took his wife back to the house, after he had driven her away at the time when Pharaoh ordered every male child of the house of Jacob to be thrown into the water.

So Amram took Jochebed his wife, three years after he had driven her away, and he came to her and she conceived. At the end of seven months from her conception she brought forth a son, and the whole house was filled with great light as of the light of the sun and moon at the time of their shining. And when the woman saw the child that it was good and pleasing to the sight, she hid him for three months in an inner room. In those days the Egyptians conspired to destroy all the Hebrews there. And the Egyptian women went to Goshen where the children of Israel were, and they carried their young ones on their shoulders, their babes who could not yet speak.

And in those days, when the women of the children of Israel brought forth, each woman had hidden her son from the Egyptians, that the Egyptians might not know of their bringing forth, and might not destroy them from the land. And the Egyptian women came to Goshen and their children who could not speak were on their shoulders, and when an Egyptian woman came into the house of a Hebrew woman her babe began to cry. And when it cried the child that was in the inner room answered it, so the Egyptian women went and told it at the house of Pharaoh. And Pharaoh sent his officers to take the children and kill them; thus did the Egyptians to the Hebrew women all the days.

And it was at that time, about three months from Jochebed's concealment of her son, that this thing was known in Pharaoh's house. And the woman hurried to take away her son before the officers came, and she took for him an ark of bulrushes, and daubed it with slime and with pitch and put the child therein, and she laid it in the flags by the river's brink. And his sister Miriam stood afar off to learn what would be done to him, and what would become of her words. (Jasher 68:1-14)

The 210y that the Hebrews spent in Egypt, were marked by the birth of Jochebed, and the 80th birthday of Moses. Jochebed was 126y old when she married Amram and must have been about 130y old when she gave birth to Moses! 130y + 80y = 210 years, that's a clear benchmark for the period in Egypt! Jochebed gave birth to a prophetess and the two key males, who lead the Israelites out of Egypt; and her children were Levites. Israel increased from 70, to 100's of thousands of people. Egypt acquired all the wealth of the region, throughout the years of drought; thanks to the wisdom, the Lord gave Joseph. Then in turn the Egyptians gave their wealth to Israel; when they left with Moses, Aaron and Miriam, after their 210y stay. Miriam was very young when she prophesied about Moses, and we also knew she was a prophetess, due to the following Bible text:-

Then <u>Miriam the prophetess</u>, the sister of Aaron, took the timbrel in her hand; and all the women went out after her with timbrels and with dances. (Exo 15:20)

The birth of Moses, reminds me of the birth of Noah, as described in the Book of Enoch.

And after some days my son Methuselah took a wife for his son, Lamech, and she became pregnant by him and bore a son. And his body was white as snow and red as the blooming of a rose, and the hair of his head and his long curls were white as wool, and his eyes beautiful. And when he opened his eyes, he lit up the whole house like the sun, and the whole house was very bright. And on it he levitated (arose) in the hands of the midwife, opened his mouth, and conversed with the Lord of righteousness.

And his father, Lamech, was afraid of him and fled, and came to his father Methuselah. And he said to him: "I have begotten a strange son, different and unlike man, and resembling the sons of the God of heaven; and his nature is different and he is not like us, and his eyes are as the rays of the sun, and his face glorious. And it seems to me that he did not spring from me but from the angels, and I fear that in his days a wonder may be performed on the earth. And now, my father, I am here to ask you and beg you that you may go to Enoch, our father, and learn from him the truth, for his dwelling-place is among the angels."

And when Methuselah heard the words of his son, he came to me to the ends of the earth; for he had heard that I was there, and he cried aloud, and I heard his voice and I came to him. And I said to him: "Behold, here am I, my son, why have you come to me?"

And he answered and said: "Because of a great cause of anxiety have I come to you, and because of a disturbing vision have I approached. And now, my father, hear me. To Lamech, my son, there has been born a son, the like of whom there is none other, and his nature is not like man's nature, and the color of his body is whiter than snow and redder than the bloom of a rose, and the hair of his head is whiter than white wool, and his eyes are like the rays of the sun, and he opened his eyes and the whole house lit up. And he levitated (arose) in the hands of the midwife, and opened his mouth and blessed the Lord of heaven. And his father Lamech became afraid and fled to me, and did not believe that he sprung from him, but that he was in the likeness of the angels of heaven; and now I have come to you that you may make known to me the truth."

And I, Enoch, answered and said to him: "The Lord will do a new thing on the earth, and this I have already seen in a vision, and make known to you that in the generation of my father Jared some of the angels of heaven violated the word of the Lord. And they commit sin and broke the law, and have had sex (united themselves) with women and committed sin with them, and have married some of them, and have had children by them. And they shall produce on the earth giants not according to the spirit, but according to the flesh, and there shall be great punishment on the earth, and the earth shall be cleansed from all impurity."

"There shall come a great destruction over the whole earth, and there shall be a flood (deluge) and a great destruction for one year. And this son who has been born to you shall be left on the earth, and his three children shall be saved with him: when all mankind that are on the earth shall die, he and his sons shall be saved. And now make known to your son, Lamech, that he who has been born is in truth his son, and call his name Noah; for he shall be left to you, and he and his sons shall be saved from the destruction, which shall come on the earth on account of all the sin and all the unrighteousness, which shall be full (completed) on the earth in his days."

"And after that (flood) there shall be more unrighteousness than which was done before on the earth; for I know the mysteries of the holy ones; for He, the Lord, has showed me and informed me, and I have read (them) in heavenly tablets. And I saw written about them that generation after generation shall transgress, until a generation of righteousness arises, and transgression is destroyed and sin passes away from the earth, and all manner of good comes on it. And now, my son, go and make known to your son Lamech that this son, which has been born, is in truth his son, and this is no lie."

And when Methuselah had heard the words of his father Enoch, for he had shown to him everything in secret, he returned and showed those things to him and called the name of that son Noah; for he will comfort the earth after all the destruction.

Another book which Enoch wrote for his son Methuselah and for those who will come after him, and keep the law in the last days. You who have done good shall wait for those days until an end is made of those who work evil; and an end of the power of the wrongdoers. And wait until sin has passed away indeed, for their names shall be blotted out of the book of life and out of the holy books, and their (children) seed shall be destroyed for ever, and their spirits shall be killed, and they shall cry and lament in a place that is a chaotic desert, and they shall be burned in the fire; for there is no earth there.

I saw something there like an invisible cloud; because it was so deep I could not look over it, and I saw a flame of fire blazing brightly, and things like shining mountains circling and sweeping back and forth. And I asked one of the holy angels who was with me and said to him: "What is this bright thing (shining)? For it is not heaven but there was only the flame of a blazing fire, and the voice of weeping and crying and moaning, lamenting, and agony."

And he said to me: "This place which you see are where the spirits of sinners and blasphemers, and of those who work wickedness, are cast and the spirits of those who pervert everything that the Lord hath spoken through the mouth of the prophets and even the prophesies (things that shall be). For some of them are written and inscribed above in heaven, in order that the angels may read them and know that which shall befall the sinners, and the spirits of the humble, and of those who have afflicted their bodies, and been recompensed by God; and of those who have been abused (put to shame) by wicked men: Who love God and loved neither gold nor silver nor any of the good things which are in the world, but gave over their bodies to torture. Who, since they were born, longed not after earthly food, but regarded everything as a passing breath, and lived accordingly, and the Lord tried them much, and their spirits were found pure so that they should bless His name. And all the blessing destined for them I have recounted in the books. And he has assigned them their reward, because they have been found to love heaven more than their life in the world, and though they were trodden under foot by wicked men, and experienced abuse and reviling from them and were put to shame, they blessed Me."

"And now I will summon the spirits of the good who belong to the generation of light, and I will transform those who were born in darkness, who in flesh were not rewarded with such honor as their faithfulness deserved. And I will bring out in shining those who have loved My holy name, and \underline{I} will seat each on the throne of his honor. And they shall shine for time without end; for righteousness is the judgment of G because to the faithful He will give faithfulness in the habitation of upright paths. And they shall see those who in darkness led into darkness, while the righteous shall shine. And the sinners shall cry aloud and see them shining, and they indeed will go where day and seasons are written down (prescribed) for them." (Enoch 106:1-108:14)

"For as the new heavens and the new earth which I will make shall remain before Me," says the Lord, "So shall your descendants and your name remain. And it shall come to pass that from one New Moon to another, and from one Sabbath to another, all flesh shall come to worship before Me," says the Lord. "And they shall go forth and look upon the corpses of the men who have transgressed against Me. For their worm does not die, and their fire is not quenched. They shall be an abhorrence to all flesh." (Isa 66:22-24)

Now it came to pass, when men began to multiply on the face of the earth, and daughters were born to them, that the sons of God saw the daughters of men, that they were beautiful; and they took wives for themselves of all whom they chose. And the Lord said, "My Spirit shall not strive with man forever, for he is indeed flesh; yet his days shall be one hundred and twenty years." There were giants on the earth in those days, and also afterward, when the sons of God came in to the daughters of men and they bore children to them. Those were the mighty men who were of old, men of renown. Then the Lord saw that the wickedness of man was great in the earth, and that every intent of the thoughts of his heart was only evil continually.

And the Lord was sorry that He had made man on the earth, and He was grieved in His heart. So the Lord said, "I will destroy man whom I have created from the face of the earth, both man and beast, creeping thing and birds of the air, for I am sorry that I have made them." But Noah found grace in the eyes of the Lord. (Gen 6:1-8)

Beloved, while I was very diligent to write to you concerning our common salvation, I found it necessary to write to you exhorting you to contend earnestly for the faith which was once for all delivered to the saints. For certain men have crept in unnoticed, who long ago were marked out for this condemnation, ungodly men, who turn the grace of our God into lewdness and deny the only Lord God and our Lord Jesus Christ. But I want to remind you, though you once knew this, that the Lord, having saved the people out of the land of Egypt, afterward destroyed those who did not believe. And the angels who did not keep their proper domain, but left their own abode, He has reserved in everlasting chains under darkness for the judgment of the great day; as Sodom and Gomorrah, and the cities around them in a similar manner to these, having given themselves over to sexual immorality and gone after strange flesh, are set forth as an example, suffering the vengeance of eternal fire. Likewise also these dreamers defile the flesh, reject authority, and speak evil of dignitaries. Yet Michael the archangel, in contending with the devil, when he disputed about the body of Moses, dared not bring against him a reviling accusation, but said, "The Lord rebuke you!"

But these speak evil of whatever they do not know; and whatever they know naturally, like brute beasts, in these things they corrupt themselves. Woe to them! For they have gone in the way of Cain, have run greedily in the error of Balaam for profit, and perished in the rebellion of Korah. These are spots in your love feasts, while they feast with you without fear, serving only themselves. They are clouds without water, carried about by the winds; late autumn trees without fruit, twice dead, pulled up by the roots; raging waves of the sea, foaming up their own shame; wandering stars for whom is reserved the blackness of darkness forever. Now, Enoch, the seventh from Adam, prophesied about these men also, saying, "Behold, the Lord comes with ten thousands of His saints, to execute judgment on all, to convict all who are ungodly among them of all their ungodly deeds which they have committed in an ungodly way, and of all the harsh things which ungodly sinners have spoken against Him."

These are grumblers, complainers, walking according to their own lusts; and they mouth great swelling words, flattering people to gain advantage. But you, beloved, remember the words which were spoken before by the apostles of our Lord Jesus Christ: how they told you that there would be mockers in the last time who would walk according to their own ungodly lusts. These are sensual persons, who cause divisions, not having the Spirit. But you, beloved, building yourselves up on your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, keep yourselves in the love of God, looking for the mercy of our Lord Jesus Christ unto eternal life. And on some have compassion, making a distinction; but others save with fear, pulling them out of the fire, hating even the garment defiled by the flesh. (Jue 3-23)
