

Moses Law

- (Mat 7:12) "Always do for other people everything you want them to do for you. That is the meaning of Moses Teachings and the Prophets.
- (Mat 23:23) "How horrible it will be for you, scribes and Pharisees! You hypocrites! You give God one-tenth of your mint, dill, and cumin. But you have neglected justice, mercy, and faithfulness. These are the most important things in Moses Teachings. You should have done these things without neglecting the others.
- (Luk 10:27) He answered, " 'Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind.' And 'Love your neighbour as you love yourself.' "
- (Joh 1:17) The Teachings were given through Moses, but kindness and truth came into existence through Jesus Christ.
- (Act 13:38) "So, brothers, I'm telling you that through Jesus your sins can be forgiven. Sins kept you from receiving God's approval through Moses' Teachings.
- (Rom 10:4) Christ is the fulfillment of Moses Teachings so that everyone who has faith may receive God's approval.
- (Rom 13:8) Pay your debts as they come due. However, one debt you can never finish paying is the debt of love that you owe each other. The one who loves another person has fulfilled Moses Teachings.
- (Rom 13:10) Love never does anything that is harmful to a neighbour. Therefore, love fulfills Moses Teachings.
- (Gal 3:24) Before Christ came, Moses laws served as our guardian. Christ came so that we could receive God's approval by faith.
- (Gal 5:18) If your spiritual nature is your guide, you are not subject to Moses' laws.
- (Eph 2:15) He brought an end to the commandments and demands found in Moses' Teachings so that he could take Jewish and non-Jewish people and create one new humanity in himself. So he made peace.
- (Tit 3:9) Avoid foolish controversies, arguments about genealogies, quarrels, and fights about Moses Teachings. This is useless and worthless.
- (Heb 7:19) Moses Teachings couldn't accomplish everything that God required. But we have something else that gives us greater confidence and allows us to approach God.
